



5. **Kingian Nonviolence Conflict Reconciliation** - Watertown Parents and Community Members were invited to register for the first introductory community course in Kingian Nonviolence Conflict Reconciliation training. This 16-hour course will be taught by our very own certified trainers, which include youth trainers from WMS & WHS, as well as trained officers from the WPD. They are excited to share with community members this fun and interactive curriculum created by Dr. Bernard LaFayette, which is designed to teach how Dr. Martin Luther King's philosophy and methodology can be applied to our present-day conflicts, on both personal and societal levels. The course will be held at the Watertown Middle School Library on Saturday January 28th and Saturday February 4th. Registration is closed. There are parents from Hosmer, Lowell, WMS, and WHS, as well as representatives from over ten different community organizations here in Watertown who registered.
